







Snake Scram Professional is effective in deterring and repelling most snakes, including many poisonous species such as rattlesnakes and copperheads. While most snake species are harmless, many varieties can strike and bite if surprised or disturbed by human activity. **Snake Scram™ Professional** is highly offensive to snakes' Jacobsen organ receptors and causes them to leave treated areas.

Assess

 Snakes prefer to locate in stone piles, wood piles, around foundations of homes, garages, barns, sheds, in gardens, flower beds, landscaping, and near pools. Snakes reveal that they are always looking for cool places to hide.

Likely places to find snakes around homes include:

- · Firewood stacked directly on the ground,
- Old lumber or junk piles,
- Gardens and flower beds with heavy mulch,
- Untrimmed shrubs and shrubs growing next to a foundation,
- Unmowed & unkept lawns, abandoned lots and fields with tall vegetation,
- Pond and stream banks with abundant debris and trash,
- Cluttered basements & attics with rodent, bird or bat problem.
- Feed storage areas in barn hay lofts where rodents abound &
- Crawl space under house.
- 22 lb. container provides protection of approx. 6,600 sq. ft at 1 lb. per 300 sq. ft.
- An 8 lb container will provide approx. 2,400 sq. feet at 1 pound per 300 sq. feet.

Treat

DAY 1: Apply to entire area where snakes have been observed and are known to inhabit. Apply beyond the area by six (6) feet. **Snake Scram Professional** should repel snakes immediately.

Repeat in 14 days, and 30 days thereafter. Reapply after heavy rains. Apply in habited area at first sign of snake presence.

Peak Application: Early spring and throughout summer months where activity has been observed in the past. Apply throughout inhabited area at first sign of snake presence. Either extreme rainfall or drought may increase snake activity. Apply around structures or exclusion areas before snake presence is detected. Avoid contact with or handling of snakes if you are unfamiliar with snake species and their proper handling.
